

Last week I attended the confirmations of four of our girls. Under the guidance of our Religious Education Co-ordinator, Ms Ellen Lonergan, the girls were prepared for this sacrament. Each of them was a credit to their families, their parishes and to our school.

Jesus showed us how to live the gifts of the Holy Spirit in our daily lives. We admire the wisdom expressed in His parables, His understanding of the poor and the sick, His right judgement when tested by the Pharisees, His courage to continue the journey to Jerusalem when He knew what fate would await Him, His knowledge of God's will, His reverence for His Father, His awe before the wonders of creation: ".... consider the lilies of the field and the birds of the air ..."

Saint John Paul II also encouraged us to look to Jesus when he wrote, "When you wonder about the mystery of yourself, look to Christ who gives you the meaning of life. When you wonder what it means to be a mature person, look to Christ who is the fullness of humanity." The seven gifts of the Holy Spirit are manifestly active in the life of Jesus and can be in our lives as well, if we choose them to be.

The Holy Spirit, who empowered the Apostles and disciples to proclaim the risen Christ two thousand years ago, is the same Spirit who empowers the young people to proclaim Christ today.

From the Leader of Teaching and Learning

On Friday students from Years 7 to 10 received their Semester One reports. Please take the time to read through the report with your daughter and to discuss her results and teachers' comments with her.

If she is to benefit from the feedback that has been given to her, it is essential that your daughter understands her teachers' suggestions and can identify ways for putting them into practice. Talking about these things will assist her to think more deeply about the ways in which she learns and to accept greater responsibility for her learning.

These conversations with your daughter will be good preparation for the parent – student – teacher interviews, which will take place on Tuesday, 14^{th} July and Tuesday, 21^{st} July. Parents of students in Years 7 – 10 should already have received a letter about these interviews and the online booking form.

Of course the holiday period should be a time for students to rest and rejuvenate. Encourage your daughter to do some of the activities for which she cannot find time during the term, particularly the physical activities that are often sacrificed as the girls move into the senior years of school. Physical activity will promote physical well-being and it is now also seen as one strategy that might assist in the prevention or management of mild anxiety.

With the Trial HSC exams for Year 12 students starting in Week 3 of next term, it is timely for us all to think about the importance of managing the many balls that we have to juggle. With each year the daily demands of life and relationships increase, so it is essential that our girls are encouraged and supported to accept the challenges they encounter, to develop strategies for managing new demands and to grow as resilient young women.

Year 7 Global Geography Wetlands Excursion



In the last week of Term 2, Year 7's enjoyed a day at the Bi-Centennial Park Wetlands located at Sydney Olympic Park in order to explore the importance of the wetland in our urban environment. Students were able to experience the fun of observing and identifying various features of the Mangrove Environment, some could even say they had a taste. Many students were willing to offer their enthusiasm and 'hands on approach' across a range of tasks including water quality testing, ph measuring and field sketches.

We also engaged in a walking tour around the Sydney Olympic Park wetlands and waterways to familiarise ourselves with the area and understand the geographical processes that form and transform this particular wetland. We tested and monitored the Mangrove environment through scientific testing, some of which we measured both the salinity and turbidity of our outlet water samples. We found that the water was fairly clean and well oxygenated at this time of year. The macro invertebrates, in particular the mangrove snails, are very important in giving us an indication of the health of our

environment.

Overall, we realised from our experiences how important the wetland environments are and what it is like being a field geographer or marine biologist for the day.

As we come to the end of Term 2, I would like to thank students for the positive approach they took to sport over the past 10 weeks. All students learned a range of new skills and enjoyed themselves during the different activities.

Each year group will rotate to a different sport next term:

YEAR 7 – AFL: Students will participate in the 'Introduce Program' run by AFL NSW. They will play game sense skill games which will lead into modified AFL games.

YEAR 8 – MOVEMENT SKILLS: Students will rotate each week to a different movement activity; cheerleading, boot camp, stretch and tone and styles of dance.

YEAR 9 – SELF DEFENCE: Students will participate in a self defence workshop run by the Sydney Self Defence Centre where they will learn to 'detect, defuse and defend.'

YEAR 10 – RECREATION: Students will complete in a variety of recreation activities to learn how they can maintain their fitness through after school sport. Students will rotate to a different activity each week:

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

Over three events on the site, artists Darren Bell, Karla Dickens, Steven Russell, Kristine Stewart, and Leanne Tobin have come together with the community, local artists and various experts to develop a vision for the future, share and collect stories, and create new artworks.
